



Our First Lab Day w/ Weebly

1	Last night, you received an email from WEEBLY that invited you to your group's website. Go and do what that email tells you to do to gain access to your website. You cannot work on the website until you do this. Follow its instructions and you will be taken to your website. From now on, go to weebly.com; then put in the email address that you just answered and your password. That is how you will log in to your website. No one has access to your password but you. If you forget, you will need to figure out what to do on your own.
2	Go to the BIO subpages that have been created just for you with your name on it. The platform lets you know (via email address) if someone else is already designing on a webpage. Only one person can work on a webpage at a time. Click refresh if the site gets stuck.
3	First we are going to work on RENAMING A PAGE. Click on PAGES. Scroll down to your BIO page (it is the page with your name on it under the section called "About Me"). Put the name there that you want: first name if you would like anonymity; full name if you want full credit and recognition for your work... or pseudonym.
4	Now each person needs to BUILD out their BIO webpage. Make sure you are using the BUILD function. Check at the top of the computer and see where it says BUILD. If it gets frozen, just hit refresh. Like with most web design, this platform works best with google chrome which may or may not be upgraded in this lab. If you are using your own laptop, consider downloading chrome for your machine (it is free... google the directions). On your BIO webpage, you must have all of the following: 1) Images 2) Words (at least 250 words--- go to the ABOUT ME directions at the course website); 3) At least one video; 4) One song, via soundcloud.
5	Make sure that you pay close attention to layout. No image or video can be free-floating in the middle of the page. You need to create a page-section or wrap words/texts around the images and videos.
6	This is a drag and drop website. You need to place all the elements that you want on a page and line everything up EXACTLY. There should be no big white/empty spaces. DESIGN the entire space.
7	Look at the 3-point spread attached here. Make sure that you understand what is expected of you. Your bio page is due Wednesday. There is no class on Wednesday. Finish the bio page. You do not need to email or submit anything on Wednesday. The bio page will be graded right on your website. If it is not done at the time of grading, you will receive a 0.
8	Come to the computer lab for the next class! We are going to work on your digital justice page. Have your prezis and/or google slides ready. Come with your essay ready to design as a webpage. Find images (make a note of the URL for the images) and videos. To see a sample webpage for what this can look like and do, go to Rebekah Love's webpage called #ThisSh*tIsForUs: https://bwequations.weebly.com/digital-story-telling.html. Notice how Rebekah breaks up the text and really creates a multimedia page. To see another sample webpage from a student who uses dividing lines to break up his research, go to Steven Talero's webpage called "Que Viva La Joteria": https://unapologeticallylatinxqueer.weebly.com/dont-call-me-papi.html. Decide which style you will use and come prepared to design your webpage.
